







The purpose of this guide is to walk you through the process of filing your taxes for the 2022 tax filing year from beginning to end with free tax filing software provided by MyFreeTaxes.org.

Self-filing is a good option for tax filers who are filing a current year tax return, are comfortable using online tax software and want to learn how to file on their own.

Please note, that we have video tutorials of this guide available <u>here</u> in English (also available <u>here</u> in ASL) that were created for tax filing year 2021 and should be used as reference only for the 2022 tax filing year and future tax filing years.

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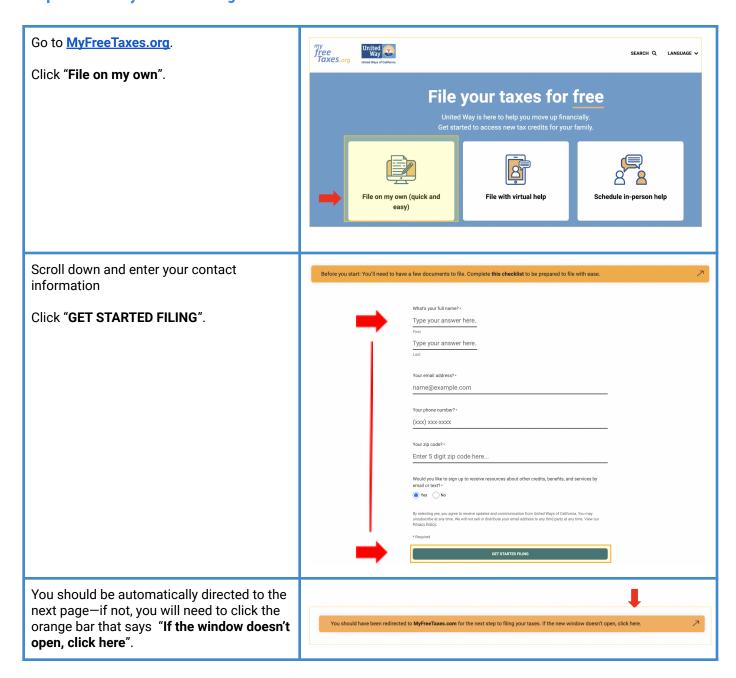

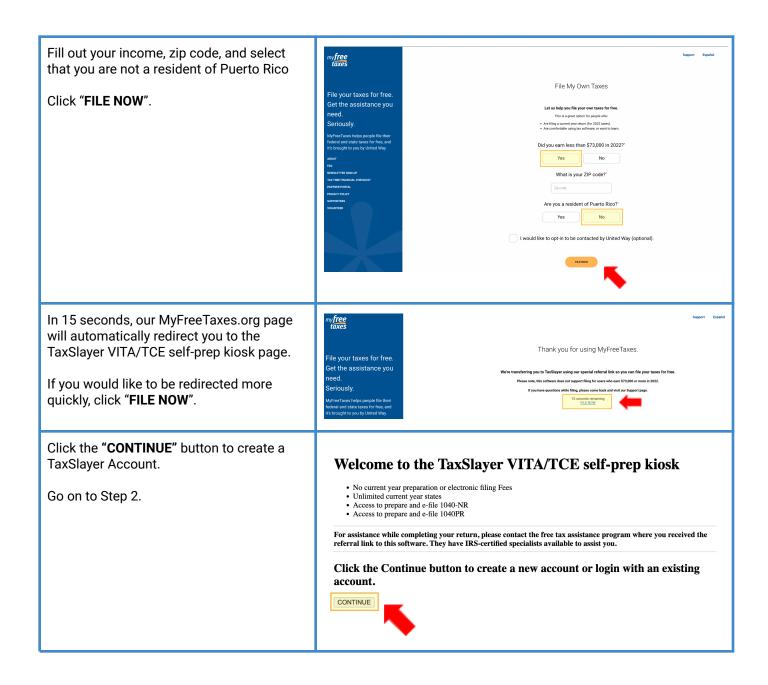




















Step 2: Create An Account With TaxSlayer - the free IRS self-filing website

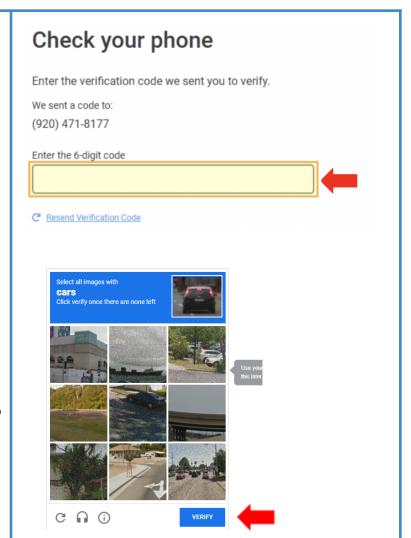
If you chose to receive your code **by text message**:

- 1. Click on "SEND CODE".
- 2. Enter the security code sent to your phone number.
- 3. Click "Verify".

If you chose to receive your code by email:

- 1. Complete the CAPTCHA (This is a question-answer type security system to verify that you are a person).
- 2. To complete the CAPTCHA, you must choose all the photos that match the indicated word
- 3. Press the button that says "VERIFY".

Please note, regardless of the method you use to verify your account, if you entered an email when creating your account, you will receive an email in your inbox to verify your email. You do not have to do this right away.



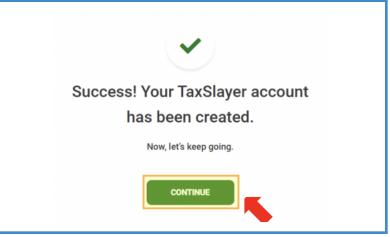




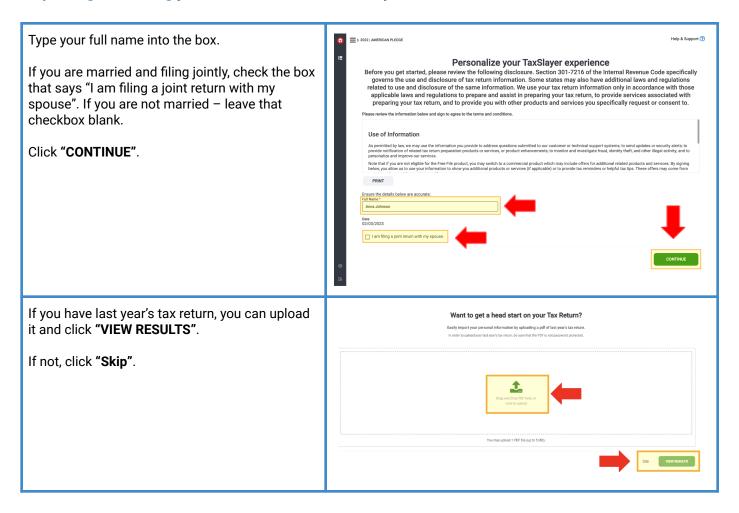

If you received unemployment compensation in 2022 you should have a 1099-G form.

- If this applies to you, click "Yes" and then click "CONTINUE". In the next page, click "BEGIN" next to "Add or Edit a 1099-G" to begin entering information from your 1099-G form.
- If you did <u>NOT</u> receive any unemployment compensation, click "No" then click "CONTINUE".

If you received a 1099-G for any reason other than the Middle Class Tax Refund, click "Yes" and then "CONTINUE". DO NOT ENTER a 1099-G received for the MCTR. Those are not considered taxable income and were printed in error.

 Form 1099-G may arrive in the mail, or you may be able to print it from your state's website. The taxable income amount can be found in box 2 and is based on your standard or itemized deductions taken on last year's return.

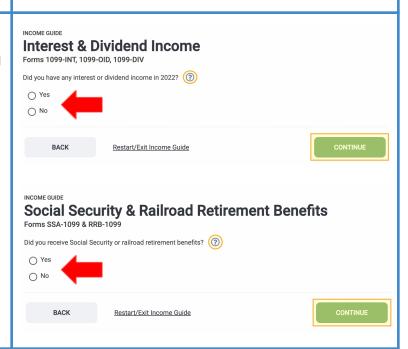

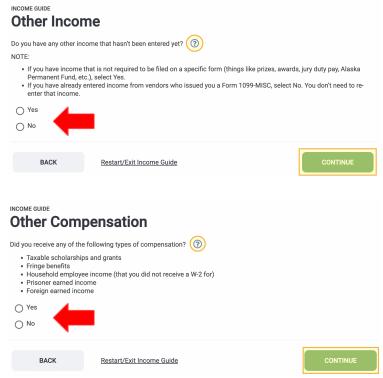

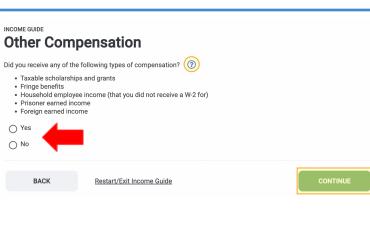


For college students:

Your taxable scholarships and grants are usually reported to you on Form 1098-T in box 5. If you used all of your scholarships and grants for tuition and course-related expenses, this is **NOT** taxable income. You would only need to report an amount as taxable scholarships if you used it to pay for other expenses, such as room, board, and travel. With this in consideration, if you have taxable income to report from scholarships and grants, follow the steps below:

- Under the "Other Compensation" section, click "Yes" and "CONTINUE".
- Click "BEGIN" next to "Scholarships and Grants".
- 3. To enter your total scholarships and grants, use this <u>spreadsheet</u>.

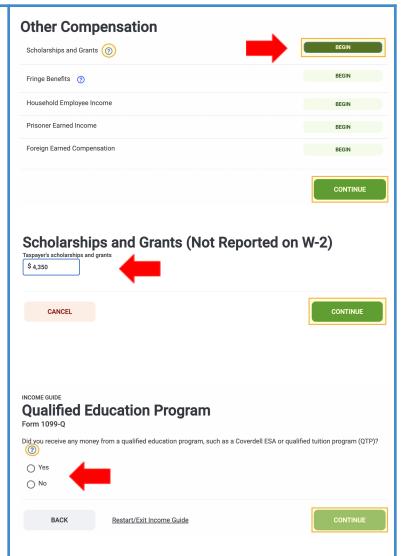


If you received money from a qualified education program, click "Yes". If not, click "No" and then "CONTINUE".

Tips:

- Qualified education programs should report all amounts distributed to you on a Form 1099-Q. To view a sample Form 1099-Q, <u>click here</u>.
- You must first determine what part, if any, of the distribution is taxable before you know what to do with the form. To determine if your distribution is taxable, you need to know how much you paid for qualifying tuition, related fees, books, and room and board, so you can determine if any part of the distribution is taxable.

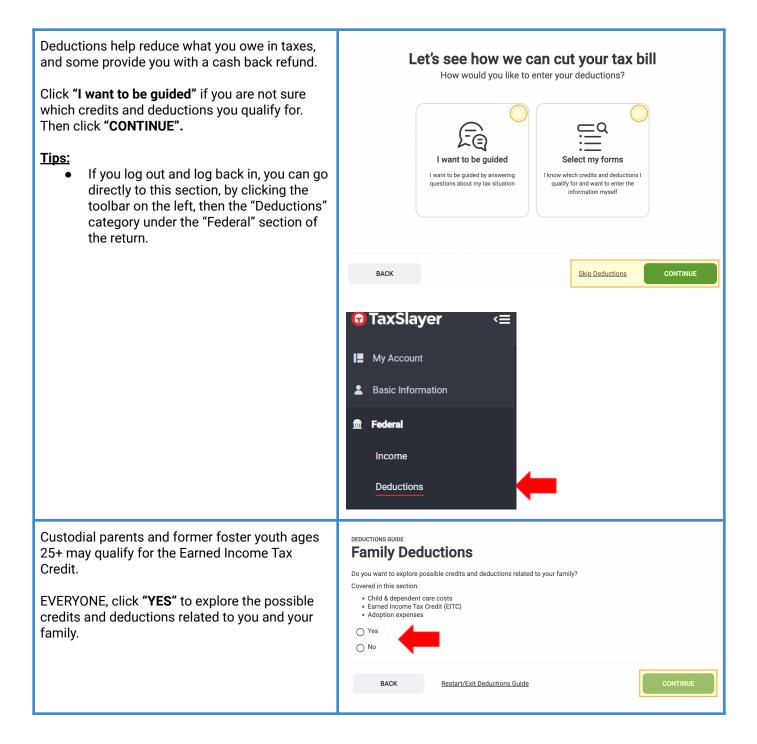
Step 5: Maximize Your Refund by entering in credits and deductions like donations to charity, school expenses, medical or service animal expenses, business expenses and more.



















If you paid for a babysitter or child care out of your own money to enter your Child and Dependent Care Credit expenses, click "Yes" and then "CONTINUE". If not, click "No" and then click "CONTINUE".

Note:

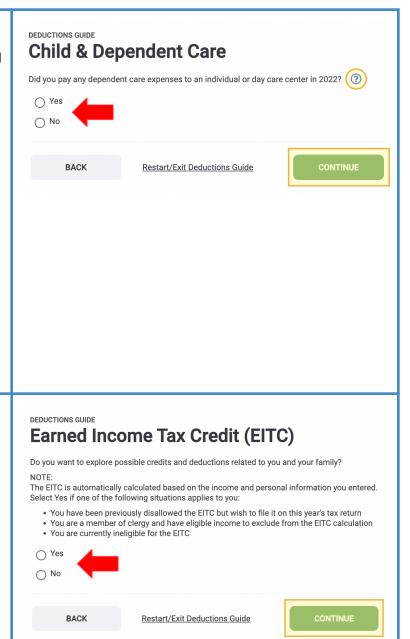
For the tax year 2022, you may be eligible for 35% of child care or similar costs up to a maximum of \$3,000 for 1 child under the age of 13 or up to \$6,000 for 2 or more dependents! Your child must be under age 13 or disabled to qualify. You may also be able to claim this credit for care paid for a disabled spouse or dependent that lived with you more than half of the year.

If you clicked "Yes", you will enter the Care Provider/Babysitter's Information and then the amount you paid for child care for each dependent in the following pages.

The EITC is automatically calculated based on the income and personal information you entered. You **DO NOT** need to fill this section out **UNLESS** one of the following situations applies to you:

- You have been previously disallowed the EITC but wish to file it on this year's tax return
- You are a member of clergy and have eligible income to exclude from the EITC calculation
- You are currently ineligible for the EITC

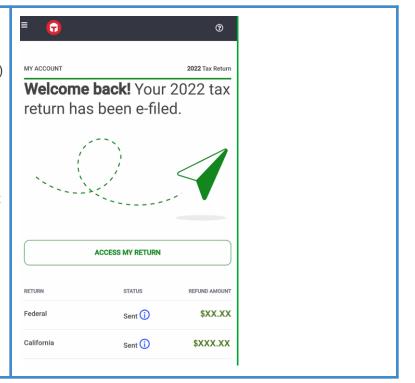


Print your return

 Save a copy of your return and your tax documents and receipts on a password protected computer, or print a copy and save your return in a locked filing cabinet along with your tax documents.

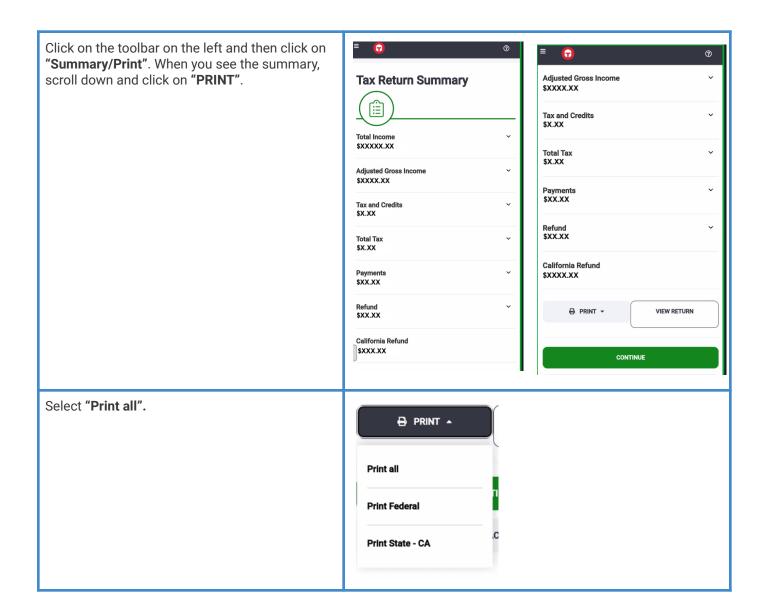










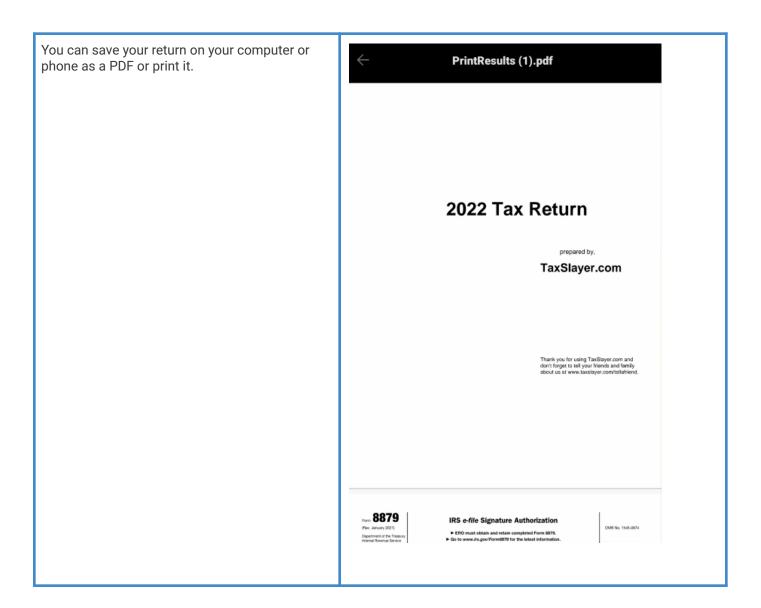
